

ST. BARTHOLOMEW'S REFURBISHMENT PROJECT UPDATE

To-date **€27,415** has been received in donations. Thanks very much to all who have contributed. In addition to painting, additional work not originally planned has also been completed. The additional work includes stencilling/artwork, refurbishment of Stations, LED lights, upholstery, and professional cleaning. The next phase of the work will begin in May and will involve painting the outside of the Church, and surrounding walls. It will also include essential repairs. The additional work means that the original estimated cost of €35,000 will be exceeded. Crossroads

Work on the removal of the Eir pole at the crossroads has started and will continue. All overhead cabling will be brought underground and the Pole which is both dangerous and aesthetically unpleasant will be removed.

There are many other projects on the drawing board, and we are **open to suggestions** for other enhancements.

The Crossroads park is a lovely place for all the community to use. There is a certain amount of upkeep needed. We have a grass cutting rota, weeding to be done, and general tidying up. It is great to get active outdoors and be sociable. If you want to offer a bit of help, even a little (as every bit helps), please drop a message to our Facebook page or to Pauline on 086-3396394 and we can keep you posted.

We are continuing to develop the crossroads and a **Replica Forge** is being built on the site of where the original Wood's Forge was in operation and where Pikes & Swords were made for the 1798 Rebellion. A lot of history involved, and it is being built by our own local stonemason Tom Brady. (*More info regarding Wood's Forge is on the next page (thanks to Declan Cooney)*.

A LOCAL FORGE by Declan Cooney

Up until the mid-20th century, one of the most important and respected trades in rural Ireland was that of the blacksmith. The blacksmith's forge was also a meeting-place where people gathered to hear news and discuss issues of the day while their horses and donkeys were being shod or their farm equipment being repaired. There is a local tradition that pikes for the 1798 Rebellion were manufactured in some of the forges in this area, also that these forges were raided by the Yeomen as a result.

Among the forges in Munterconnaught were Galligan's in Beherna, Lynch's in Lurganboy and Flanagan's in Ryefield. Another well-known forge belonged to the Woods family in Ryefield, centrally located at the crossroads still known as "Woods's Cross". The Woods family had a long association with this area. In 1796, a Charles Woods was included on the list of individuals from Munterconnaught who were awarded the Flax Grower's Bounty. The census of 1821 shows that Patrick Woods aged 30, a farmer and smith, was at that time residing in Ryefield with his wife Margaret. A journeyman smith, Edward Cahill, resided there also. Two male servants and one female servant were also employed. It is highly likely that this is the Patrick Woods, blacksmith, who seven years earlier had provided an alibi for a prisoner charged with the assassination of the Yeomanry captain, Bryan O'Reilly, thus proving the man's innocence.

By 1857, the forge was no longer being worked by the Woods family. Griffith's Valuation of that year lists Margaret Woods and Alicia Woods in Ryefield. Bryan Cadden, a sub-tenant of Margaret Woods, is described as having tenancy of "a house and forge".

The Schools' Folklore Collection of the 1930s includes the following account of the blacksmith by a pupil in one of the local schools:

"A smith is paid according to his work done and sometimes he is given a crib of turf by a grateful customer. A forge is also a place of gossip and all issues are discussed there while the smith swings his heavy sledge. He is a dark man of great muscular strength, wearing a leather apron and having a cheerful word for all."


Connecting You! Youth Work Ireland Cavan Monaghan's (YWICM)

The TLC KIDZ Project is a community coordinated response for children and mothers in recovery from domestic violence and abuse. The Project seeks to create a common vision and shared responsibility among services in supporting the recovery of children.

At the core of the TLC KIDZ Project is the TLC KIDZ Programme. This is a 12 week group work programme for children and their mothers who have experienced domestic abuse.

The children's group and mother's group run concurrently on the same week and cater for children aged between 5-17 years old.



Referral Criteria:

- Open to children between the ages of 5-17 (in appropriate age groups) depending on availability
- For children & young people residing within counties Cavan and Monaghan
- Separation has occurred and the perpetrator no longer resides at the family home
