## CHRISTMAS IN THE 1930s By Declan Cooney.

All the extracts are from material submitted to the Schools' Folklore Collection by pupils of Knocktemple, Ballydurrow and Ryefield.

The 1930s was a difficult time for many people in Ireland. The country, in common with the rest of the world, was emerging from the Great Depression. The effects of the Economic War with Britain were still being felt. Unemployment and emigration were at high levels while prices for agricultural produce were low. In 1938, material was being collected through the national schools for the Schools' Folklore Collection. The contributions from the local schools have few or no references to shopping, presents, Christmas trees or Christmas cards. The following extracts from the collection give us some idea of how the feast was celebrated in those frugal times.

- (1) "On Christmas Eve, the night of Christmas Day, New Year's Eve and the night of New Year's Day and on the night of the Epiphany, a lighted candle is placed in every window of the house and is left burning until bedtime".
- (2) "Usually beefsteak is served at breakfast on Christmas morning, then the people go to Mass. The first Mass is at seven o'clock, followed by a second, usually the third is an hour later. When they come home from Mass they prepare the dinner. They get a turkey or a goose and roast it. In some places, a young pig about two stone is killed, stuffed and roasted. In the evening tea is served with sweet cakes......games are played before bedtime".
- (3) "Several other choice foods are eaten, among them plum pudding, jellies, trifles, fruits and pies. Whiskey, wine and mineral waters are in every house during the festive season. Parties are held and return parties are given".
- (4) "On St. Stephen's Day, boys and girls dress up in ridiculous fashion with faces masked. They carry musical instruments and a money box. They visit as many houses as they can from early morning till 11 pm. They play and dance and if offered refreshment will take it. They get money, more or less, in every house. This they divide amongst them before dispersing at night. Sometimes they sing verses about the wren such as:

"The wren, the wren, the king of all birds, On St. Stephen's Day was caught in the furze, Up with the kettle and down with the pan, Give us a penny to bury the wran. Although he is little, his family is great,

Rise up, young lady, and give us a treat. And if you will, we will bless your store If you don't, we'll bury the wren outside your door."

#### FRAUDSTERS - Don't let fraudsters win

**Trust your gut instinct.** Always be cautions when taking calls or clicking on links. If the link comes to you (and you were not searching for it) pay special attention.

Don't click on links that ask for personal details.

Examine the content of text messages and watch out for these common tactics used by Fraudsters:

- Unnecessary and overuse of <u>CAPITAL LETTERS</u> to demand your attention
- Requests to "<u>Take immediate action</u>" or "<u>Urgent action needed</u>" or that you have <u>a short</u> window of time to act.
- <u>POOR SPELING</u> a serious indicator that it may be a scam.
- Use of fake URL's (the links in the text messages),
- Claims from authorities, institutions or known service providers to get you to trust the message and respond. E.g. Revenue, or a Financial Institution, or an electricity/phone provider.
