CHAMPIONS! by Declan Cooney

St. Patrick's Day in 1929 is a date of some significance in the history of the GAA in Munterconnaught. It was on that date that Munterconnaught, captained by Jack Rahill from Ballydurrow, defeated Lacken Celtic by 2-3 to 1-3 to claim their first ever championship title. This was actually the Junior Championship final of 1928 and Munterconnaught had reached the decider, clocking up an impressive fifteen victories along the way. The first final ended in a draw and the replay was called off because of severe weather conditions – hence the postponement until the following March.

The *Anglo-Celt* reporter described the game as "full of life and vigour from start to finish. Munterconnaught were the more polished footballers and on the day's play the better team won".

Supporters made their way to Breffni Park, some on bicycles, more in pony and trap, some on horseback and even a few on foot. Winning the championship was a remarkable achievement for a club which had only been in existence for two years. No doubt this achievement made up for the disappointment of the 1927 final which Munterconnaught had lost by two points to Cornafean.

Unfortunately, there is no photo of that championship-winning team. However, on p. 206 of "Munterconnaught A History" there is a team photo which seems to be from 1926 or 27. It includes many of the players who were on the team which won the final, also a number of the club officials.

The TLC KIDZ Project is a

community coordinated response for children and mothers in recovery from domestic violence and abuse. The Project seeks to create a common vision and shared responsibility among services in supporting the recovery of children.

At the core of the TLC KIDZ Project is the TLC KIDZ Programme. This is a 12 week group work programme for children and their mothers who have experienced domestic abuse.

The children's group and mother's group run concurrently on the same week and cater for children aged between 5-17 years old.



Referral Criteria:

- Open to children between the ages of 5-17 (in appropriate age groups) depending on availability
- For children & young people residing within counties Cavan and Monaghan
- Separation has occurred and the perpetrator no longer resides at the family home


